<p><b>Welcome &amp; New Member Introductions</b> <i>Dennis Cooley, MD, Chair</i></p>	<p>Dr. Cooley welcomed the KMCHC members and visitors. All new members and guests were introduced.</p>	
<p><b>Review &amp; Approval of Jan. 11, 2017 Minutes</b> <i>Dennis Cooley, MD, Chair</i></p>	<p>It was moved by Ms. Yadrich and seconded by Ms. Schunn to approve the 1/11/2017 minutes. All approved.</p>	
<p><b>ACES &amp; Trauma-Informed Care Reflection</b> <i>Connie Satzler</i></p>	<p>Ms. Satzler lead a session to reflect on Adverse Childhood Experiences study (ACEs) and Trauma-Informed Care Action Items that members accomplished from the January KMCMC meeting.</p> <p>Members shared the following activities that have occurred since January:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Nurses Training on ACEs</li> <li>- KAAP Training on ACEs at educational meetings.</li> </ul> <p>Members commented on challenges and looking ahead on the following activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Talked about how to share more about ACEs to a wide variety of professionals. Approach this at the community level and make training available to MCH partners and their networks, including faith-based organizations, law enforcement, social services, and more.</li> <li>- Mental Health First Aid (youth and adult training) – 8 hour training that helps individuals recognize signs and symptoms of mental health. Also, provide tools to deescalate mental health situations. Find more online at: <a href="https://www.mentalhealthfirstaid.org/cs/">https://www.mentalhealthfirstaid.org/cs/</a>.</li> <li>- Broadening ACEs education to make available to foster parents, childcare providers, Infant/Toddler services.</li> <li>- Promote a message of caring.</li> <li>- Help with “connecting the dots” to find out: Are needs being met? Are the needs of the Special Health Care Needs (SHCN) population being met?</li> </ul> <p>KPoP – Kansas Power of the Positive Update by Traci Reed. KPoP addressing ACEs by analyzing and summarizing data from the behavior risk factors. KPoP needs help in distributing this data information. There is a conference on Nov. 1 on this information.</p>	
<p><b>Help Me Grow</b></p>	<p>Ms. Smith reviewed the progress on the Kansas - Help Me Grow model and</p>	

<p><b>Implementation Update</b> <i>Heather Smith, KDHE</i></p>	<p>approach. This is a national model with technical assistance that provides a state-based approach to assist with coordinating care and services for children and families. Kansas will be moving forward to become a Help Me Grow affiliate state.</p>	
<p><b>PRAMS Launch Update</b> <i>Lisa Williams &amp; Julia Soap, KDHE</i></p>	<p>Ms. Williams provided an update on the PRAMS project and the first-year Survey that will be distributed to moms (at 3-months postpartum). She answered questions from Council members about the Survey questions.</p> <p>Discussion Items:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Meaning of the PRAMS logo and how to promote.</li> <li>- A Flyer will be developed to help promote. More information about Kansas PRAMS is available here: <a href="http://www.kdheks.gov/prams/">http://www.kdheks.gov/prams/</a>.</li> </ul>	<p>Lisa and Julia and the PRAMS team will develop an informational Flyer about the PRAMS Survey for moms. These Flyers will be distributed to KMCHC members.</p>
<p><b>Lived Experience: Essential to Creating Change</b> <i>Kayzy Bigler, KDHE</i></p>	<p>Ms. Bigler asked what role the members play on the council. The Council’s goal is to have 2 family members for each Domain Group to have them provide knowledge of what is needed at the family level. These family members can provide insight on what works and what may not work.</p> <p>Discussion Items:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Family Engagement in Title V – journey on their Life Course.</li> <li>- Family prospective: “nothing about us, without us”.</li> <li>- Diversity is critical.</li> <li>- Cultural competency.</li> <li>- KS Early Childhood Family Engagement Standands.</li> <li>- Head Start and Early Head Start experiences.</li> </ul> <p>Ms. Gaumer provided information about her family with specifics on her SHCN children.</p> <p>Mr. Caldwell provided information on his wife and children. His children had the same pediatric office for all their children, birth – 18 years old. He told a story about his son’s vision issues.</p> <p>Ms. Bigler asked each group to discuss three questions about family input and benefits and how that input is being incorporated in your daily routine. Each Group reported out on the three questions. She asked members to set a goal on how to engage families within their agency or work. Then asked them to add how they plan to support family members within the KMCHC.</p> <p>There was a question on “outcomes” issues and how that is being reported from partners and asking grant applicants to write about levels of engagement and</p>	

	quality of engagement in the outcomes of their individual programs.
