

Domain Group Immunization Reference Sheet Wednesday, January 13, 2021

Issues, Challenges, and Opportunities for Improvement

- Growing mistrust in public health and <u>vaccines during COVID-19 pandemic</u> with <u>common themes of vaccine</u>
 <u>opposition</u>, especially among certain populations; <u>increase in vaccine opposition efforts in Kansas</u> and across
 country; <u>mistrust of COVID-19 vaccine</u>
- 2. Declines in routine child and adolescent vaccination during COVID-19 pandemic

3. Women-Maternal Domain

- a. Tdap and flu shots for pregnant women
- b. Tdap for family members and care givers, how it protects baby
- c. Helping pregnant women make informed decisions about protecting their baby with vaccinations
- d. Target population for <u>vaccine opposition messaging</u>
- e. <u>MMR check during pregnancy or before pregnancy</u>; awareness of <u>vaccine considerations for pregnant</u> and lactating <u>women</u>

4. Perinatal-Infant Domain

- a. Building <u>vaccine confidence</u> among new parents, decision to <u>immunize on-time with the recommended</u> <u>schedule</u>
- b. Hep B vaccine birth dose
- c. Safe sleep connections: vaccine opponents have attempted to tie SIDS to vaccines, though <u>there is no</u> evidence of this
- d. Breastfeeding: <u>natural immunity</u>, vaccinate before delivery, breastfeeding during or immediately after immunizations can <u>help reduce pain for infant</u>, vaccine considerations for <u>breastfeeding mothers</u>

5. Child Domain

- a. Promoting vaccine confidence
- b. Vaccinate on time with recommended vaccine schedule
- c. <u>Maintain/restore</u> childhood immunization <u>rates during/post-pandemic</u>
- d. <u>Schools/school nurses</u> opportunities to ensure up-to-date immunizations
- e. Model school exclusion policy
- f. Maintain current Kansas regulations related to school vaccine requirements

6. Adolescent Domain

- a. Kansas <u>low adolescent vaccine rates, particularly HPV</u>
- b. HPV vaccine
- c. Meningococcal ACWY vaccine, Men B vaccine
- d. <u>Tdap/bundling of adolescent vaccines</u>
- e. Increasing awareness of importance of vaccines and building vaccine confidence among adolescents
